5th NSMM scientific meeting and the 22nd Annual Meeting of the Swedish Society for Clinical Mycology

The next and fifth Scientific Meeting of NSMM, arranged in collaboration with the Swedish Society for Clinical Mycology, will take place on May 22nd 2008, Stockholm, Sweden. NSMM Course Histopathology in Medical Mycology: Theory to Practice

A one-day course on the diagnosis of fungal infections by histopathology will be held at the Department of Pathology, Karolinska, Huddinge, Stockholm on May 21st 2008 by Professor Henrik Elvang Jensen, University of Copenhagen, Denmark. The course will cover the most important mycoses with focus on the diagnosis including discussions of methods, diagnostic strength, differential diagnoses, pitfalls, etc. The course will be a composition of lectures and practical exercises at the microscope for the morphological recognition of fungi. The application of immunohistochemistry for the identification of fungi to the genus and/or species level in tissue will be covered in the lectures.

RECENT EVENTS

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2007

The AGM 2007 was held just after the scientific meeting held in Helsinki. The minutes will be sent to all members separately by the NSMM Secretary.

4th NSMM scientific meeting 2007: Superficial Fungal Infections

The 4th scientific meeting was held on May 30th in Helsinki at the Biomedicum Helsinki and organised by the Finnish Society for Medical Mycology in conjunction with the NSMM. This years meeting focused on superficial fungal infections. **Jack Sobel** from the Department of Medicine, Wayne State University School of Medicine, Detroit, USA gave the key-note lecture on Recurrent Recurrent Vulvovaginal Candidiasis: Advances in Pathogenesis and Treatment. This was a very useful and timely update on a difficult to treat infection. The Nordic perspective of recurrent vulvovaginitis was given by **Professor Jorma Paavonen** of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Uni-

versity of Helsinki. Continuing the theme of superficial infections, Jouni Issakainen, from Turku, Finland presented a detailed review of Non-dermatophytes as Agents of Onychomycosis. Professor Jan Faergemann for the Department of Dermatology, Sahlgrenska University Hospital in Gothenburg updated the meeting participants on new treatment options for onychomycosis. The use of probiotics is a contemporary topic at the moment and Malcolm Richardson from the Department of Bacteriology and Immunology, University of Helsinki gave a lecture on the use of probiotics in controlling oral candidosis. The infectious diseases specialists viewpoint on topical issues in superficial fungal infections was given by Veli-Jukka Anttila and Asko Järvinen, both from the Division of Infectious Diseases, Helsinki University Central Hospital. Dr Anttila spoke about skin and mucosal manifestations of systemic fungal infections, and Dr Järvinen gave his perspective on the problems associated with antifungal therapy for superficial fungal infections. The theme of the symposium was complemented with three clinical case presentations given by Else Svejgaard and Merete Hædersdal, both from Denmark. We hope that everyone enjoyed the meeting as much as we did and thank all the speakers and participants for coming.
