Upcoming NSMM Membership events

2nd NSMM scientific meeting. First announcement. April 1st 2005.

The next scientific meeting of the Nordic Society for Medical Mycology will be held in Copenhagen on April 1st 2005. This is the day before the opening of the ECCMID conference also held in Copenhagen.

This meeting will focus on "Proper Use of Antifungals" and will include topics such like

- Antifungal agents currently available and ones being developed
- Pharmacokinetics / pharmacodynamics (PK/PD)
- Clinical use in different fungal infections e.g. Deep versus superficial infections, vaginitis and other mucosal infections, solid organ infections, skin infections, eye infections and subcutaneous infections such as Madura foot, etc.
- Correct dosing in various clinical groups such as children, renal or hepatic insufficiency, immunodeficiency etc.
- Combination therapy
- Susceptibility and resistance epidemiology

Medical Mycology Introduction Seminar, March the 31st 2005.

A one-day course in medical mycology will be held in Copenhagen at Statens Serum Institute March 31st 2005. The course will be mainly theoretical, however, cultures of different fungi and

susceptibility plates will be demonstrated for those who are interested. The course will focus on the essentials of medical mycology and is aimed at doctors and clinicians without advanced mycology training. Topics will include

- Introduction to fungi. Classification and taxonomy
- Superficial fungal infections
- Invasive fungal infections
- Epidemiology
- Antimycotics
- Susceptibility testing
- Diagnostics

The number of participants for this course is limited to 50 and applicants will be handled on a first come first serve basis.

NRMM

A new Nordic group on fungal methodology, called Nordic Reference Group on Methods in Medical Mycology (NRMM), has been formed by a Swedish initiative. The main focus of the group will be methods related to fungal identification, antifungal susceptibility testing and resistance development. In addition, the group will aim to develop a Nordic quality assessment scheme in mycology. The main focus of this scheme will be educational. NRMM will consist of 1-2 members from each of the Nordic countries. The members shall be elected by national organisations (e.g. The Norwegian Society for Medical Microbiology, The Danish Society for Clinical Microbiology etc.). The Nordic Society for Medical Mycology will act as a "host" for NRMM and may, if deemed necessary, elect one additional member. NRMM information will appear on the NSMM home page. The following NRMM members have been elected: Norway: Peter Gaustad and Per Sandven, Sweden: Erja Chryssanthou and Victor

Fernandez, Finland: Markku Koskela, Ice-

land: Ingibjorg Hilmarsdottir and Denmark: Maiken Cavling Arendrup.
