The Nordic Reference group on methods in Medical Mycology (NRMM) is still in its early phase. The first "Nordic EQA shipment" has recently been distributed in the Nordic countries. It consisted of five simulated patient samples to be handled exactly the same way as ordinary, routine specimens are handled. Enclosed in the shipment were questionnaires focusing on the methods used. It is our hope to be able to provide knowledge on methodologies used in the Nordic countries as well as the result of the specimens tested in a report in the near future.
